Project includes relocating existing Mount Prospect Road, Tank Farm Road and Willow Creek to enable construction of proposed Runway 9C/27C and extension of existing Runway 9R/27L on the North Airfield. This project also includes construction of proposed Taxiway WK which will connect the west end of existing RW 9L/27R on the north to the west end of future RW 9C/27C on the south. The Work includes site and building demolition, earth excavation/embankment, roadway and taxiway paving, structures, tunnel, channel retaining walls, prefabricated equipment shelter, guard booths, reinforced box culvert installation, grading, fencing, temporary and permanent erosion control, maintenance of traffic, drainage, utilities, sanitary lift station, roadway and taxiway pavement markings, signage and lighting, and traffic signals.
