New kiosk offers travel information

A touch-screen kiosk providing travel information in seven languages has been installed in the baggage claim area of Terminal 3 at O'Hare International Airport, officials said Thursday.

The electronic kiosk, which dispenses airport, hotel and transportation information, is the first of nine of the devices that will be installed by 2008, according to the Chicago Department of Aviation.

Information, including flight status updates and weather reports, is available in English, Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Japanese and Spanish.

The kiosk also provides information about city events and attractions.

Travelers can use phones connected to the kiosks to make free calls to service providers linked to the system.
